Clive Sheldon QC is recognised as a Leading Silk in the fields of Employment Law, Administrative & Public Law, Education Law and Local Government Law. Clive has mediated:

- A race discrimination dispute between employee and former employer
- A nuisance/trespass dispute between neighbours
- A disability discrimination dispute between current employee and public sector employer
- A dispute between a tenant and social housing landlord
- A negligence/nuisance/slander dispute between neighbours
- A holiday contract/personal injury dispute
- A dispute between a professional and his regulator
