Christian J. Tams is Professor of Public International Law at King's College London, and the President of the European Society of International Law.

Christian's practice focuses on international litigation and arbitration. He regularly represents States in proceedings before international courts and tribunals such as the ICJ and ITLOS, and acts for investors or respondent States in arbitral proceedings under the main frameworks of investment arbitration (ICSID, ICC, UNCITRAL).

Christian frequently advises parties in domestic cases implicating questions of international law and has e.g. participated in cases before the German Federal Constitutional Court and the US Supreme Court. He is a member of the appointment committee of the German Court of Arbitration for Sports, having been a member of the Court for 10 years.

In addition to contentious matters, Christian advises States and non-State actors on a wide range of legal questions, among them the scope of sovereign immunities, the enforcement of international awards and the impact of sanctions
