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## Commercial and Business Protection

Zac acts for SS&C, a global technology company, in a multi-party team move case involving allegations of employee solicitation, document misappropriation and software copying. Zac assisted SS&C in obtaining wide-ranging imaging order relief against the Defendants at the outset of the proceedings. The proceedings are ongoing. 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### Baring Investment Services v Wheeler

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### Brown & Brown v The Broker Investment Group Ltd & Ors

(KBD)

Zac acted for the Defendants, Broker Investment Group and 11 other Defendants in a team-move case in the insurance broker industry. The claim was listed for a speedy trial but settled before trial. Zac was led by Daniel Stilitz KC and instructed by DWF Law LLP.

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## Sheikh Mohamed Bin Issa Al Jaber & Ors v Salfiti & Ors

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for five defendants in combined and complex multi-million-pound civil fraud proceedings involving allegations of identity theft, document manipulation, bribery and secret commissions. The claim settled at trial. Zac acted throughout the proceedings, and succeeded in discharging a freezing injunction obtained ex parte against Mr Salfiti with indemnity costs ordered in his client's favor ([2018] 11 WLUK 46). Zac was led by Olivier Kalfon, of Maitland Chambers, and acted with Charles King (also of Maitland Chambers) and James Partridge (of 2TG).

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## MBI International & Partners Inc (in Liquidation) v Sheikh Mohamed Bin Issa Al Jaber, Salfiti & Ors

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for Mr Salfiti in a cross-border insolvency claim for c.£250 million brought by the liquidator of a BVI company. The claim against Mr Salfiti was discontinued following the exchange of witness statements.

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## Durlston Partners v Franco & Others

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Claimant in a team move/breach of confidence case involving claims for breach of post-termination restraints, breaches of fiduciary duty, breaches of confidence and unlawful means conspiracy. Zac succeeded in obtaining undertakings over to a speedy trial (given at the hearing of the application for injunctive relief). The case was settled before trial. Zac was instructed by RWK Goodman.

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## Allen & Anr v Rabobank

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acts for the Claimants who seek indemnification from their former employer in respect of their legal costs in defending criminal proceedings arising out of the LIBOR scandal. The claim was the subject of an unsuccessful application for summary judgment ([2020] EWHC 1902 (Comm)), in which Zac was led by Richard Leiper KC).

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## Rollingson v Hollingsworth & Ors

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Claimant in a team move case involving claims for breaches of contract, breaches of fiduciary duty, dishonest assistance, unlawful means conspiracy and inducement. The claim settled before trial, following an unsuccessful application by the Defendants for strike out and/or reverse summary judgment on significant aspects of the claim which raised interesting questions as to the scope of without prejudice privilege in the context of negotiations to acquire a right of action ([2020] EWHC 3568 (QB)). Zac was led by Richard Leiper KC and instructed by Lewis Silkin.

## Richard Pease v Henderson Administration Ltd

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the claimant, an investment fund manager, who brought a claim against his former employers for breach of contract arising out of its failure to pay him c. £4 million in management fees and its failure to allow him to replace the manager of a £1 billion investment fund on termination of his employment. Mr Pease successfully defended Henderson's counterclaim for c.£2 million in the High Court, a decision which was reversed on appeal to the Court of Appeal. Zac was led in both the High Court and Court of Appeal by Richard Leiper KC, and instructed by Michelmores.

## Employment

Zac regularly appears as sole counsel in the Employment Tribunals and Employment Appeal Tribunal in high value and complex claims. Zac has particular experience in whistleblowing and discrimination claims, and an interest in cases involving discrimination on grounds of belief.

## Miller v University of Bristol.

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acts for Professor David Miller in a high profile claim against the University of Bristol in which Professor Miller alleges discrimination on grounds of his holding anti-Zionist beliefs. An appeal to the EAT is due to be heard in 2025.

## Beldica v British Council

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the British Council in its successful appeal to the EAT in a case concerning the interplay between the ET's jurisdiction, the Human Rights Act and the law of diplomatic immunity.

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## Rustambekov v Fieldfisher

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acts for Fieldfisher in a claim concerning alleged sexual misconduct by a senior associate. Fieldfisher has been granted permission to appeal to the EAT. The appeal is due to be heard in 2026.

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## Gale & Ors v Yorkshire Cricket Club

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for Yorkshire Cricket Club in relation to high profile claims for unfair dismissal, victimization and (in two cases) race discrimination brought by former coaches of Yorkshire Cricket Club who were dismissed by the Club in connection with the widely publicised allegations of racial discrimination and harassment made by former player Azeem Rafiq. Zac was successful in obtaining deposit orders in relation to claims of racial discrimination. All claims were settled before trial.

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## Thompson v Informatica

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Respondent in both the Employment Tribunal and the EAT. Before the ET, the Respondent successfully defended a whistleblowing and ordinary unfair dismissal claim brought by a senior executive who had been dismissed for breaching the employer's anti-bribery and corruption policies. The trial was heard over 6 days. The Claimant appealed the dismissal of his unfair dismissal claim to the EAT. That appeal was dismissed.

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## Fleming v East of England Ambulance Service NHS Trust

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the appellant, who successfully challenged a decision of the Employment Tribunal to exclude his covert recording of the private discussions of a disciplinary panel. The EAT ruled that the recordings were admissible, except those parts that were caught by legal professional privilege (led by Jane McCafferty, instructed by Steeles Law).

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## Data Protection and Information

Zac has acted in a number of high profile data protection disputes.

Zac has appeared, both as sole and junior counsel, in a number of information law cases, including **Galloway v Information Commissioner** (2017) and **All Party Parliamentary Group on Drones v ICO and Ministry of Defence** (2017) (led by Timothy Pitt-Payne KC). He has also advised on a range of data protection issues, and has appeared in the county court in data protection matters.

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## Gorgianeh v Baroness Foster

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted in high profile proceedings brought by a student who appeared on University Challenge with a soft toy mascot which Baroness Foster stated on Twitter had been an antisemitic symbol. The claim settled with a public apology from the Baroness, and was widely reported. Zac was instructed by Rahman Lowe.

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## Oldknow v Evans

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Labour Party in high-profile defamation proceedings brought by a former senior Labour Party official in connection with allegations made in a leaked internal report concerning the Labour Party's handling of anti-semitism complaints (led by Anya Proops KC, instructed by Greenwoods GRM).

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## Whyte v CBS Interactive Inc & Anr

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

(Media and Communications List), a privacy claim by the well-known boxer Dillian Whyte arising out of the publication of an article discussing Mr Whyte testing positive for a banned substance in advance of a high profile fight. Zac has also acted in a number of other cases over the years, including: ***(R on the application of Tirkey) v the Lord Chancellor & the Director of Legal Aid Casework*** [2017] EWHC 3403, a challenge to the operation of the statutory charge (led by Peter Oldham KC, instructed by the Anti-Trafficking and Labour Exploitation Unit); ***Leicester City Council in R (on the application of Jewish Human Rights watch) v Leicester City Council in both the High Court*** ([2016] EWHC 1512 (Admin)) and the Court of Appeal ([2018] EWCA Civ 1551), a challenge to a resolution of the Council calling for a boycott of goods produced in Israeli settlements in the Occupied Palestinian The Council successfully defended that claim in the Divisional Court and in the Court of Appeal (led by Andrew Sharland KC), and ***Gulf Center for Human Rights v the Prime Minister in both the High Court*** ([2016] EWHC 1323 (Admin)) and the Court of Appeal ([2018] EWCA Civ 1855), a challenge against changes to the Ministerial Code (led by Jason Coppel KC and Hannah Slarks, instructed by Deighton Pierce Glynn).

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## Al Haq v Secretary of State for Business and Trade

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for Al Haq in its challenge to the SSBT's decision not to suspend arms licenses for the supply of F-35 parts to Israel during the ongoing war in Gaza. Zac undertook the oral advocacy at the hearing before the Divisional Court on the Geneva Conventions, Genocide Convention and Articles of State Responsibility.

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## Diaspora Alliance v Secretary of State for Education

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acts for the Claimant in a challenge to the SSE's decision to adopt the IHRA working definition of antisemitism as the cornerstone of a proposed training programme for schools, colleges and universities, without making proper provision for the protection of free speech and equality obligations. The claim is currently stayed.

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## R (on the application of Tax Returned Ltd) v Revenue and Customs Commissioners

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Claimants in a challenge to the adoption of a new mandatory form for claims for PAYE tax relief. The Claimants obtained permission for their claim following a contested hearing in September 2022, in which the Court granted retrospective permission for service of the Claim Form by alternative means (judgment of Heather Williams J, [2022] BTC 29. Zac is led by Joanna Clement KC, and instructed by Hill Dickinson.

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## GB News v Ofcom

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Another of the Lawyer's top 20 cases of 2025. Zac acts for Ofcom in a judicial review challenge to the lawfulness of its finding that GB News breached the Broadcasting Code in relation to its broadcasting of a "People's Forum" programme featuring the then Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak. Zac is led by Anya Proops KC.

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## Bouchti v Enfield LBC

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Claimant in a statutory review of orders providing for a lower traffic neighborhood in Enfield. The claim was dismissed by Eyre J in November 2022. Zac was led by Clive Sheldon KC.

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## R (on the application of the Palestine Solidarity Campaign) v Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government in the High Court

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Zac acted for the Claimant in a challenge to guidance from the defendant Secretary of State which sought to prohibit the administering authorities of the local government pension schemes from adopting policies of boycott, divestment and sanction against foreign nations (led by Nigel Giffin KC, instructed by Bindmans). The Supreme Court held that the challenged part of the guidance was contrary to the Padfield principle.

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## Good Law Project v Secretary of State for Health and Social Care

2008 EWHC 1583 (QB)

Acting for the Claimant in a challenge to the lawfulness of the Secretary of State's award of a number of high value contracts for the supply of PPE during the Covid-19 pandemic. The claim raised important questions as to the scope of the duties of equal treatment and transparency in the context of contracts awarded under regulation 32 of the PCR 2015, and resulted in a number of judgments on matters of procedure ([2021] 5 WLUK 226; [2021] 5 WLUK 316). Judgment on the substantive challenge is awaited.

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## Public International

Zac has extensive experience dealing with public international law issues in both domestic and international courts and tribunals.

Zac was involved in human rights litigation conducted in a key African jurisdiction which raised a number of important public international law and human rights law issues, and which ended successfully for his client at appellate level.

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### Advisory Opinion proceedings concerning the consequences of Israel's occupation.

Zac acted for Palestine in advisory proceedings before the ICJ concerning the legal consequences arising from Israel's occupation of the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, and the Gaza Strip. Zac was led by Philippe Sands KC and Paul Reichler, together with colleagues from outside of chambers.

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# Procurement / Competition

Zac acted for Serco throughout the proceedings, led by Joseph Barrett and instructed by DWF.

Zac has also acted as both junior and sole counsel in a number of other procurement matters. He acted for Camelot in an interlocutory hearing before O'Farrell J in the **IGT v Gambling Commission** litigation ([2023] EWHC 1420 (TCC)).

Zac also has experience in competition law. He acted for the Claimant in **Balmoral Tanks Limited v CMA** in both the CAT ([2017] CAT 23) and the Court of Appeal ([2019] 4 CMLR 25; [2019] EWCA Civ 162)), the first decision of the UK courts on information exchange infringements.
